**FR. MIKE REVEALS HIS RACE PLAN FOR THE KENTUCKY DERBY  
MINI MARATHON 13.1 MILES OF FUN! Friday, April 23, 2021  
8:30a.m.**

My upcoming road race, the Derby Mini Marathon, has kept me training daily throughout the winter. The course is new departing from Butchertown's newly opened Lynn Soccer Stadium beside I-64. A short distance away we turn off River Road to climb the elevated walkway approaching the Big Four Bridge to run over to Southern Indiana. A half mile away we quickly descend the bridge ramp to Clarksville's Pearl Street and turn west to run about six miles along the Ohio River. The restaurant row we pass ends the roadway portion, and most of the run happens on the trail to New Albany. Lewis and Clark embarked on a three-year adventure to discover the West from this very point. I will stay on the trail for forty-five minutes before reaching 18th street and turn back to retrace my steps.

This is about the time I will try to increase the pace and heart from a tempo run to my threshold pace that I can only hold for about sixty-five minutes like 155-160 beats per minute. The loneliest segment happens around mile eight when I am nearing the Falls of the Ohio but cannot see downtown Louisville through the dense tree line beside the river.

I have practiced charging through this part every Wednesday. I plan to keep up my turnover, the number of steps per minute, at a high rate like 178 steps per minute. suddenly the bridges will come into view, and I can tear down the embankment of the flood wall to the street below. I will hope to look gazelle like passing restaurant row on the way back to the bridge. Actually, I will look like a middle-aged back of the pack runner, breathing so hard that people in front of me will know I am passing before I yell, "on your left." Oh well, some things are worth doing poorly because we still can do it. The thrill of that moment along the river front disappears when looking up at the approach to the Big Four Bridge on Pearl Street. this is when the fun stops and the pain sets in for anyone racing. Let me offer a comparison.

At the Winter Olympics we see the snow jump tower and the landing area. This is an apt description of the approach to the Big Four Bridge. Imagine trying to run up from the landing area of the snow jump course, then cross the takeoff ramp and then climb up the entire ramp into the tower. That my friends is the awesome challenge at mile twelve to reach the bridge to Kentucky. It would be irrational to keep the same pace going up toward that bridge. I will slow down for sure but not my heart-beat which will keep climbing. At last, I will reach the crest and the level ground of the bridge, but I am not out of trouble. I pray the wind will not blow hard on the bridge; some Wednesday's in training I felt the wind seem to hold me in place like a wall. We runners can only lean into the wind and suck it up knowing in about two minutes the steeple of St. Joseph Church will rise into view. Then below the bridge there will be the soccer stadium beyond I-64 to focus on.

This is when the fun resumes if there is anything left in the tank to fuel the effort. The downward spiral ramp from the Big Four Bridge dumps onto River Road. Without effort, gravity speeds the descent toward the street, and it is a quick right6 onto River Road and left onto Witherspoon to run under I-64 like a tunnel.

Tragically we exit the tunnel only to turn east and see the road rise to reach the finish line. A final act of treachery. O.K. it is not that much of a rise but trust me on this. Runner's will sigh and curse and lose focus if this is a surprise. I have practiced this and know to kick with my arms swinging to the finish line, effort generally wasted running long distance.

I had a choice of painful races to run, the Mini or the Marathon. The full 26.2-mile course inevitably leads to a full body attack of fatigue somewhere past twenty miles for most. Seemingly out of the blue we go from the form of a gazelle to a rhinoceros.

The pain of the Mini is nobler. Individual body parts ache from the constant pace from the start line. Those running the shorter Mini Marathon are going half the distance of the marathon, but they are running painfully faster than the typical marathoner does from the start line.

A Mini raced at the faster pace improves a runner's form altogether. It can set up the next training period for a faster marathon. This too is my hope October 11 either in Boston or Chicago. I have unfinished business in Boston. You see in 2019 I ran the Boston like a maniac way too fast too early and felt a runner's crucifixion at mile twenty onward. I finished as tight as a Tin soldier marching; this is not the way to finish. Either way I hope to run a smart marathon by setting and holding a realistic pace. Chicago is a marathon of neighborhoods which would keep things interesting till it finishes once again uphill which is going to hurt.
