PERMISSION GRANTED TO RESUME USING ALL PEWS AND OTHER CHANGES EFFECTIVE MAY 15TH.

St. Rita and St. Luke will remove the red tape floor signs and encourage use of all pews effective Saturday, May 15th at Masses. The guidance from Archbishop still requires "at least three feet of distance between family groups." "In order that Masses may continue to be accessible to everyone, even vaccinated persons are asked to continue wearing masks at Mass." To facilitate the collection, "baskets on handles may be passed by hospitality ministers." "Parishes may resume the practice of bringing forward the gifts of bread and wine at the preparation of the gifts, so long as those presenting and receiving the gifts sanitize their hands immediately before and after this ritual." "Hymnals may be returned to pews if desired." Please do not sanitize your hands when entering church if you plan to hold the hymnals. The prohibition on exchanging a sign of peace and the distribution of the Precious Blood remain in effect. These changes were announced on April 30th by Archbishop Kurtz with permission to implement as soon as May 3rd at the discretion of the pastor.
